FIA Environment Policy

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The FIA is the largest fire protection trade association in Europe with 1000+ members. We are a not-for-profit organisation and a major provider of fire safety training.

Our objective is to promote, improve and perfect fire protection & firefighting methods, devices, services, and apparatus. We achieve this through the representation of our members, providing technical support, guidance, and opportunities for professional advancement through education and appropriate regulation.

We are committed to understanding, managing and mitigating any environmental harm caused by our organisation.

To accomplish this, we will proactively:

1. Comply with all applicable compliance obligations (including environmental legislation and regulations) and any other requirements imposed by legislation, members and stakeholders.
2. Identify, assess and periodically re-assess our environmental impact(s). As a service-led organisation our key impact is climate change although we also have minor impacts relating to waste and water.
3. Measure and publicly report our performance on key environmental impact areas. For climate change, we do this by disclosing our scope 1, 2 and 3 greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions in accordance with the GHG Protocol best practice.
4. Set objectives and targets to reduce our environmental impacts. For climate change, our targets are aligned to the Science-Based Target Initiative (SBTi) recommendations and include an ambition to be Net Zero by FY50.
5. Implement practices to continually improve our environmental performance. These include the use of on-site solar panels, electric vehicle charging points and applying the waste hierarchy of reduce, reuse and recycle.
6. Promote environmental awareness to industry stakeholders from the design, development, production to the service and distribution of products. Including, where practicable, the use of environmentally friendly materials, the recycling of waste materials, and the distribution of environmentally friendly products.
7. Provide relevant and practical information, instruction and training to members and employees who may impact the environment.
8. Promote environmental best practice within our industry to those outside our industry.
9. Produce and make publicly available our Environmental Policy.

This policy applies to all employees, visitors, contractors and/or suppliers to FIA and associated activities and functions.
